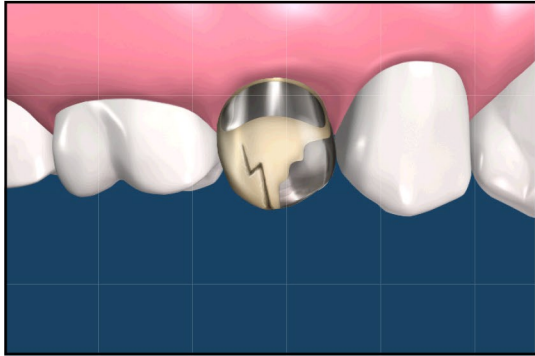
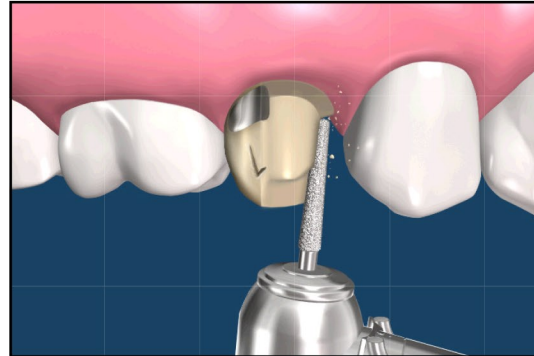


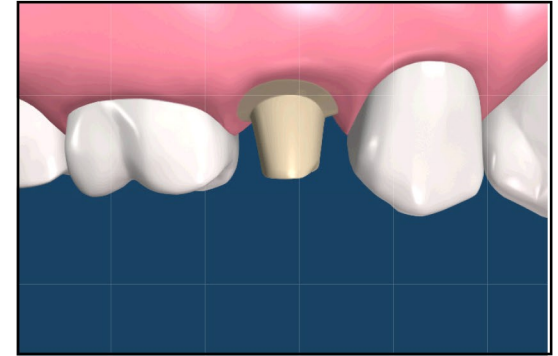
Placing a Ceramic Crown



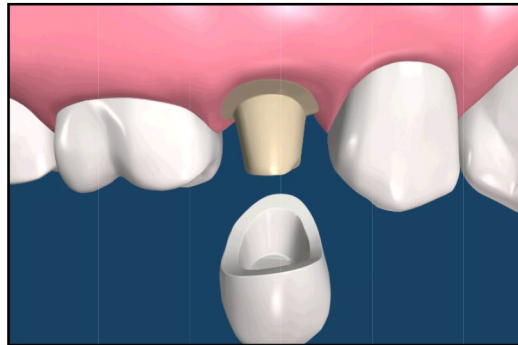
1) A heavily restored tooth with lots of fillings can be very weak and may become unsightly. A ceramic crown is an ideal way to correct these problems.



2) To place a crown, we first need to remove the damaged surface layer of the tooth.



3) This creates a solid core, free of any weak areas.



4) A natural looking ceramic crown can then be placed on top of this prepared core. Since the crown is a solid structure cemented in place, it provides long-term strength and stability.



5) In addition to being strong, your new crown also greatly improves the quality of your smile. In many cases, a crown is indistinguishable from your natural teeth.
